BACHS offers a great team environment as well as ongoing training and development opportunities. We are seeking a new Transport Officer to provide safe, reliable and supportive transport service to patients.

The key objectives of the role include:

- Provide a professional and reliable transport service to patients.
- Assist in the booking for the transport system.
- Work collaboratively with other teams to ensure that transport services are completed in a timely and effective manner.

Activities of the role include:

- Safely transport patients to and from Bourke as required and in time for scheduled appointments.
- Transport patients to and from specialist appointments safely and in time for scheduled appointments.
- Provide high level customer service, information and general support to patients.
- Coordination and management of cleaning, servicing and maintenance of all transportation vehicles.
- Monitor the safety practices of the transportation service and regularly inform the Deputy CEO on the performance of the service, the welfare of the passengers and any difficulties when transporting clients.
- Utilise track system to monitor vehicle usage and ensure that all documentation is maintained.
- Effectively collaborate with team members to ensure that the transport function is operating effectively and efficiently, while maintaining a harmonious team environment.
- Compliance with and understanding of EEO legislation.
- Assist in the development of and comply with policies and procedures to ensure that the practice is demonstrating consistent practices.

• Attend all mandatory training requirements and participate in staff performance reviews.

- Ability to build relationships with all levels of the organisation and the community

- Ability to maintain confidentiality and to exercise tact, initiative and sound judgement
- Demonstrated ability to work flexibly within tight time schedules and in accordance with variable workload demands
- Ability to hold all relevant security clearances including National Police Check and Working with Children clearances
